

Mission News



As daffodils bloom in the door yard, we welcome the promise of Spring and close our first quarter of Mission Commission activities. Mission is working this year to augment our robust financial support strategies with donation and volunteer opportunities to encourage broader congregation engagement in this important dimension of our church. We continue with two donation campaigns to collect goods for outstanding local organizations, The Furni-

ture Bank (FB) of the Holy Lutheran Church of Manasquan and the Blessing Bag Brigade (BBB). Bins located in the narthex will stay in place through Easter season to collect items for both organizations. Bigger donations can be stored downstairs.

For Furniture Bank, targeted items include smaller-sized sofas and love seats, chairs, end tables, coffee tables, lamps, beds, dressers or chests, night stands, kitchen tables and chairs (favorites are small drop leaf tables with 2 chairs), small dining room tables (best are 60" or less and <40" wide without the leaves; with 4-8 chairs), small appliances like coffee pots, toasters, toaster ovens, countertop microwaves, pots, pans, kitchen gadgets like spatulas and cooking spoons, dish sets (favorite is Corelle), flatware, queen/double/single bed linens, and bathroom towels. BBB is looking for donations of bottled water, individually packaged snacks like granola bars, socks, deodorant, disposable razors, toothbrushes, and travel-size toiletries such as toothpaste, soap/body wash, lotion, shampoo, and other personal hygiene items.

Early in the year, we donated to Doctors without Borders and Presbyterian Disaster Relief Funds targeting Ukraine, Syria and Turkey given ongoing conflicts and earthquake disasters in those regions. More locally, we continued our commitments to Covenant House - helping young people facing homelessness; Fulfill NJ – which provides 972,000 meals each month in Monmouth and Ocean Counties; Interfaith Neighbors – which offers an array of services for the most vulnerable and works actively to improve the quality of life for individuals families and communities with programs including Meals on Wheels, affordable housing, an early childhood learning Center, rental and mortgage assistance, and even an urban farm!

In the category of social justice, we again supported the Bard Prison Initiative which now enrolls over 300 students across seven interconnected prisons in NY state to offer associate and bachelor degree for persons in prison. Watch the documentary film by Lynn Novick 'College Behind Bars' for more insights into the power of education and this program.

We donated to two new organizations: The Lifeguard Ecumenical Foundation founded in 2009 by a group of neighbors in Fair Haven to raise awareness of those around us in need of assistance. (This mission member ran into the Atlantic Ocean on New Year Day in 2022 for this organization!) And we learned about and donated to the Support our Troops Project managed by the Nativity Church also in Fair Haven which send care packages to those deployed overseas.

Finally, with summer coming soon, we continued to support Camp Johnsonburg, established to provide experiential Christian education in support of the Presbyterian Church in NJ, offering several weeks of camping and leadership training for youth.

Mission Commission meets the 4th Monday of every month at 7:30 on the church zoom number. All are welcome!

Earth Day Beach Clean Up Sat., Apr. 22 from 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM


