We all knew that our time here in Rumson was temporary, but we were hoping to be with you until you had a clear path to your next permanent pastor. As I shared in an email to all of you, it is for personal reasons that we feel the need to move back to Florida at this time. Our experience here at Rumson Presbyterian was a blessed one, and there was nothing here that pushed us away.

As we leave, we are very aware of the anxiety that many of you are feeling. We all know that this church community has become very small, and many questions concerning its future are being asked. That has been true throughout our interim time with you. Our session meetings have been mostly focused on the need to think creatively, and differently, about future leadership models. These conversations are ongoing, and we don't have all the answers yet. The Coastlands Presbytery, through its Commission on Ministry, is in conversation with the session about different ways for this church to find the pastoral leadership it needs at this time in its life.

Even though those conversations are ongoing, there is one thing that this church does need: It is you. It needs your attendance, your involvement, your support, and your prayers. In the



days ahead, your church leaders will be sharing with you the options and ideas that have been evolving during the last several months. The session will also share with you the ideas and suggestions of the Presbytery. Together, you will discern the best path for the future. Be assured that you are not alone. The Presbytery is with you, and God is with you.

As the Apostle Paul wrote his letter to the Philippians, he said some words to that congregation that express exactly what I would like to say

to this congregation. So I quote him here as words to you: "I thank God every time I think of you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the Gospel from the first day until now." (Philippians 1:3-5)

Mission Commission took a brief hiatus for the month of July and met again last week to continue discussions about an event we are planning for January 2024 with an international hunger relief non-profit organization called Rise Against Hunger. Rise Against Hunger coordinates the packaging and distribution of food and other aid to people in developing nations. A representative joined our call to describe how a 10,000 meal packing event might work for our congregation — and we are very excited to plan community outreach for 30-60 volunteers to join us in this mission! This organization cites the benefits of food security as hope thrives alongside nutrition, learning increases with stability, and self-sufficiency leads to growth. The meal packing experience combines an assembly line process with an educational experience, "not only make a huge impact worldwide, but to touch the lives of those in your group." The event can be open to a range of volunteers, making it suitable for families, high school students in search of community service credits and senior citizens alike. Lee Clay has experience with this organization and brought this idea forward. It seems well aligned to our desire to find ways to draw people into this magnificent community at Rumson Presbyterian in a time of transition. Stay tuned for additional updates on this topic!




